- 2. Read Romans 16:1-16. In spite of the fact that Paul had never been to Rome, he sends greetings to more than 25 people by name. What previous contacts did Paul have with these people? Why does he appreciate them?
- 3. Use your imagination. From what we know about Paul and the Romans, how might the people in this chapter have "risked their lives," "worked very hard" and "been a great help" to Paul and others? In what practical ways might we imitate their example?
- 4. Read Romans 16:21-23(24). The body of Christ is made up of a diverse group of people, but at times the variation in our strengths and abilities can result in some misunderstandings. How does knowing that the church is meant to have differing gifts and roles help us appreciate that there are no "little people" on the team?
- 5. Read Hebrews 10:24-25. We talked about how all too often we trip up in thinking that Christianity is just an individual pursuit of knowing God.
