4. Read Romans 6:11-14. Why is it necessary to "consider, count, or
reckon" ourselves dead to sin and alive to God (verse 11)? What
are some practical ways in which you can fulfill the commands of
verses 11-14 in your life?
5. Are there sins you have grown tolerant toward? Think of a way you
struggle not to sin. What would it look like positively to present/offer
that part of your body/character as an instrument of righteousness?
6. How is God shaping and molding you? How do you resist his work?
