LIFE GROUP DISCUSSION:

- 1. Where is the line between self-concern, which can be appropriate, and selfishness?
- 2. Read Romans 15:1-13. How was Jesus (see verse 3) the greatest example of what Paul commands in verses 1-2? If we follow Christ's example in this and other areas of our lives, why will we need endurance, encouragement and hope (see verses 4-5)?
- 3. In contrast to the discord and mistreatment suggested in Romans 14, what does God desire of us (verses 5-6)? How can the fact that Christ has accepted us promote both unity and praise (verse 7)?
- 4. In verses 9-12, Paul quotes from four different Old Testament passages. What words and phrases express the dominant mood of these passages? Why do you think this mood is appropriate for all who hope in Jesus?
- 5. It can be no small challenge to listen to others when dealing with push back or disagreement on unclear issues. Though at times it's appropriate to kindly walk away, being willing to hear a different point of view is part of respecting others. How do the following proverbs help us to know how to listen to others, even when we disagree? (Proverbs 10:19; 12:15; 12:16; 17:27; 18:2)
- 6. Christian fellowship and biblical truth are both important sources of hope and encouragement for believers. What is the unique role of each, and why are both necessary?
